AB 5      **AUTHOR:** Wolk (D)  
**TITLE:** Flood Protection: Local: Central Valley: Plans  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Creates the Central Valley Flood Protection Plan to address flood protection in the central valley. Authorizes local agencies to create a local plan of flood protection meeting the requirements of the bill. Requires priority for state funds to be given to local agencies that have adopted a local plan of flood protection. Creates the Local Flood Protection Plan Assistance Fund to award grants.

AB 14      **AUTHOR:** Laird (D)  
**TITLE:** Discrimination: Civil Rights Act of 2007  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Enacts the Civil Rights Act of 2007. Subjects licensees under this Business and Professions Code to disciplinary action if the discrimination is based upon the prospective recipient's sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, disability, medical condition, martial status, or sexual orientation. Provides that nothing in these provisions would require any healing art practitioner to perform a licensed activity for which he or she is qualified.

AB 41      **AUTHOR:** La Malfa (R)  
**TITLE:** Water Resources: Bond Proceeds  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Relates to the Disaster Preparedness and Flood Prevention Bond Act of 2006, the Safe Drinking Water, Water Quality and Supply, Flood Control, River and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2006. Declares that funds derived from these bond acts be expended in the most cost-efficient and effective manner possible.

AB 49      **AUTHOR:** Arambula (D)  
**TITLE:** Disaster assistance.  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Authorizes the Director of Finance to transfer moneys in the Special Fund for Economic Uncertainties to the state Small Business Expansion Fund for use as authorized by the director, in an amount to make loan guarantees in order to prevent business insolvancies and loss of employment in an area affected by a declared disaster. Adds the extreme weather during the month of January 2007 to the list of specific events eligible for funding under the state Disaster Assistance Act.

AB 62

**AUTHOR:** Nava (D)

**TITLE:** Disaster Relief

**PIFC Staff:** MP

**SUMMARY:**

Provides for state allocations with respect to property tax revenue reductions resulting from a reassessment for damages incurred within the Counties of Riverside and Ventura, which were declared by the Governor to be in a state of emergency due to wildfires. Provides that any dwelling that qualified for the exemption prior to 09/04/06, that was damaged or destroyed by the wildfires, and has not changed ownership may not be denied the exemption on the basis that the dwelling was temporarily damaged.

AB 70

**AUTHOR:** Jones (D)

**TITLE:** Flood Liability

**PIFC Staff:** MP

**SUMMARY:**

Subjects a city or county to joint liability, whether or not the city or county directly participates in the operation or maintenance of a flood control project, for property damage sustained in a flood by approving new development in an undeveloped area that is protected by a project levee where flood levels are anticipated to exceed 3 feet for a 200-years flood event.

AB 78

**AUTHOR:** Torrico (D)

**TITLE:** Political Reform Act of 1974

**PIFC Staff:** ER

**SUMMARY:**

Requires all committees regulated under the Political Reform Act to establish campaign accounts, require certain reports to be made relating to the accounts, and require the interest on all of the accounts required by the act to be paid to the State Treasury, for deposit into a specified account.

AB 156

**AUTHOR:** Laird (D)

**TITLE:** Flood Control

**PIFC Staff:** MP

**SUMMARY:**

Authorizes the Department of Water Resources to provide meals and other necessary support to any person engaged in emergency flood fight activities. Requires the department to prepare, and the Reclamation Board to adopt, a schedule for mapping areas at risk of flooding in the Sacramento River and San Joaquin River drainage. Authorizes the board or the department to establish a program of mitigation banking for the activities of the board or the department.

AB 162      **AUTHOR:** Wolk (D)  
**TITLE:** Land Use: Water Supply  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Requires a city or county general plan to identify an annually review of those areas covered by the general plan that are subject to flooding as identified by floodplain mapping prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency or the Department of Water Resources.

AB 217      **AUTHOR:** Beall (D)  
**TITLE:** Vehicle License Fee: Biennial Payments  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Amends the Vehicle License Fee Law, which establishes, in lieu of any ad valorem property tax upon vehicles, an annual license fee for any vehicle subject to registration in this state in the amount of .065 % of the market value of that vehicle. Requires payment of such fee on a biennial basis.

AB 218      **AUTHOR:** Saldana (D)  
**TITLE:** Vehicles: Fees  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Provides that when a smog certificate is required for renewal a special license plate is not made until the smog certificate is received by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

---

AB 248      **AUTHOR:** Gaines (R)  
**TITLE:** Vehicles: Violations: Punishment  
**PIFC Staff:** MG / ER  
**SUMMARY:**  
Clarifies in the list of traffic violations of the Vehicle Code a violation related to a motor vehicle speed contest as a misdemeanor, that under the exception described above, the violation is punishable as a misdemeanor or a felony. Provides the same with respect to the violation related to reckless driving that is punishable as a misdemeanor or a felony.

AB 254      **AUTHOR:** Gaines (R)  
**TITLE:** Vehicles: Total Loss Salvage Vehicles  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Makes a technical, nonsubstantive change to existing law that defines total loss salvage vehicle for purposes of the Vehicle Code.

AB 263      **AUTHOR:** Arambula (D)  
**TITLE:** Property tax revenue allocations: Fresno Metropolitan Flood Control District  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
States the intent of the Legislature to enact the necessary statutory changes to modify the property tax revenue allocations from the Fresno Metropolitan Flood Control District to the ERAF in the County of Fresno to correct an error made in the calculation of those allocations.

AB 267      **AUTHOR:** Calderon, C. (D)  
**TITLE:** Annuity Sales: Seniors  
**PIFC Staff:** ER / MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Requires an insurance producer agent or insurer, when making a recommendation to a senior consumer, for the purpose or exchange of an annuity to have reasonable grounds for believing that the recommendation is suitable for the senior based on the facts disclosed by the senior relating to his or her financial situation and needs. Requires insurers to establish a system to supervise compliance with the placement of annuities to senior consumers.

AB 303      **AUTHOR:** Spitzer (R)  
**TITLE:** Manslaughter, Vehicular  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Increases the term of imprisonment to 7 years to life in the state prison for gross vehicular manslaughter while intoxicated.

---

AB 319      **AUTHOR:** Nava (D)  
**TITLE:** Emergencies: Tsunami Hazard Mitigation  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Enacts the Tsunami Hazard Mitigation and Preparedness Act of 2007, to establish the Tsunami Steering Committee to guide tsunami hazard preparation activities in the state. Requires the Office of Emergency Services to establish a statewide tsunami hazard mitigation program to maintain consistent planning efforts regarding preparation, communications, response, and mitigation in the event of a tsunami.

AB 326

**AUTHOR:** Benoit (R)

**TITLE:** Identity Theft

**PIFC Staff:** ER

**SUMMARY:**

Amends existing law that provides that any person who falsely personates another and does any act whereby, if done by the person falsely personated, might make him or her liable to any suit or prosecution is punishable by a fine, by imprisonment, or by both. Provides that it is unlawful for any person by means of a Web page, electronic message, or otherwise through use of the internet, solicit, request or take action to another person's identity.

AB 355

**AUTHOR:** Price (D)

**TITLE:** Elections: Voter Registration: Provisional Bonds

**PIFC Staff:** ER

**SUMMARY:**

Authorizes every elector who qualifies to vote in the state to register or reregister on election day at a polling place in his or her precinct or at the office of the elections official, and to cast a provisional ballot for the election.

AB 357

**AUTHOR:** Mendoza (D)

**TITLE:** Political Reform Act of 1974: Legal Funds

**PIFC Staff:** ER

**SUMMARY:**

Allows funds that are not subject to voluntary campaign contribution limits to be used for attorney's fees and other expenses related to election recounts and litigation related to recounts and election contests. Exempts expenditures related to election recounts and litigation related to recounts and election contests from voluntary expenditure ceilings.

AB 372

**AUTHOR:** Salas (D)

**TITLE:** Personal Information: Civil Penalties

**PIFC Staff:** ER

**SUMMARY:**

Relates to destruction of a customer's records, security procedures, and protection of information from unauthorized access, destruction, use, modification, or disclosure. Requires disclosure of breach of that data. Relates to disclosure of personal information to 3rd parties. Imposes a civil penalty.

AB 373

**AUTHOR:** Wolk (D)

**TITLE:** Local government: the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982

**PIFC Staff:** MP

**SUMMARY:**

Amends the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act to include a statement of the priority that various kinds of public facilities have for financing recreational program services, library services, maintenance services for schoolsites and structures, and the operation and maintenance of museums and cultural facilities. Revises vote requirements to provide that a vote on a special tax to be levied on such services. Authorizes community facilities districts for lighting and open space.

AB 404

**AUTHOR:** Ruskin (D)

**TITLE:** Political Reform Act of 1974: Disclosure

**PIFC Staff:** ER

**SUMMARY:**

Requires that advertisements published, displayed, or broadcast for or against a candidate, that are paid for by independent expenditures, expressly state that they are not being made on behalf of a candidate or candidate-controlled committee.

AB 425

**AUTHOR:** Adams (R)

**TITLE:** Vehicles: Motorcycles: Safety Helmets: Exceptions

**PIFC Staff:** MG

**SUMMARY:**

Exempts from a requirement that a driver and any passenger are to wear a safety helmet meeting certain requirements when riding on a motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, or motorized bicycle, a driver who is 18 years of age or older who has either completed a motorcycle rider training program, or has been issued a class M1 license or endorsement or a comparable license or endorsement from another jurisdiction, for 2 years or more.

AB 430

**AUTHOR:** Benoit (R)

**TITLE:** Vehicles: Speed Contests and Wreckless Driving

**PIFC Staff:** MG

**SUMMARY:**

Includes one or both of the crimes of wreckless driving or engaging in motor vehicle speed contests within the scope of various existing statutes including, among others, provisions relating to time limits for destruction of court records, and exceptions to requirements that insurance companies not raise premium rates where the insured or applicant has been convicted of a traffic violation while driving an employer's vehicle during the course of employment.

AB 449      **AUTHOR:** Strickland (R)  
**TITLE:** Vehicle License Fees  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Provides for a vehicle license fee law establishing, in lieu of and ad valorem property tax upon vehicles, an annual license fee for any vehicle subject to registration in this state.

---

AB 468      **AUTHOR:** Ruskin (D)  
**TITLE:** Vehicles: Abatement of Abandoned Vehicles  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Authorizes a county service authority to use registration fees as well as the moneys received from the Abandoned Vehicle Trust Fund for the abatement and removal, or the disposal of abandoned vehicles.

---

AB 500      **AUTHOR:** Lieu (D)  
**TITLE:** Civil Actions: Telephonic Appearances  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Permits a party to appear by telephone in any conference or hearing at which witnesses are not expected to be called to testify. Requires the party choosing to appear by telephone to provide notice. Permits a court to provide teleconferencing appearances by entering into a contract with a private vendor.

AB 512      **AUTHOR:** Lieber (D)  
**TITLE:** Personal Information: Security Breaches  
**PIFC Staff:** ER  
**SUMMARY:**  
Adds private medical and health care records to the definition of "personal information," thereby requiring a state agency, or a person or business that conducts business in California, to disclose a breach of the security of a person's unencrypted medical or health care records.

---

AB 517      **AUTHOR:** Horton (R)  
**TITLE:** Political Reform Act of 1974  
**PIFC Staff:** ER  
**SUMMARY:**  
Prohibits candidates for elective state office from soliciting or receiving a contribution during a specified 30 day period during the first and second years of regular session and during the entire time the Legislature convenes in a special session during the interim recess between the first and second years.

---

AB 522      **AUTHOR:** Duvall (R)  
**TITLE:** Nonadmitted Insurers  
**PIFC Staff:** ER  
**SUMMARY:**  
Extends existing law that specifies various duties of nonadmitted insurers and surplus line brokers transacting business in this state. Gives applicants and policyholders the right to notice of the power to cancel the policy within 5 days under specified circumstances, and that the broker fee must be returned and that the premium must be prorated when a policy is cancelled.

AB 536      **AUTHOR:** Portantino (D)  
**TITLE:** Fire Protection: State Responsibility Areas  
**PIFC Staff:** ER / MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Deletes the prohibition of the Board of Forestry and Fire Protection to classify all lands within the state for purpose of determining areas in which the financial responsibility of preventing and suppressing fires is primarily the responsibility of the state, including within state responsibility areas, lands within the exterior boundaries of certain cities.

AB 545      **AUTHOR:** Walters (R)  
**TITLE:** Insurance Fraud  
**PIFC Staff:** ER  
**SUMMARY:**  
Authorizes the Public Employees Retirement System to obtain information from an insurer for purposes of determining the eligibility of a member, or unlawful application or receipt of benefits, under the Public Employees Retirement System. Adds the Public Employees Retirement System to the list of authorized governmental agencies to which an insurer is required to release that information.

AB 551      **AUTHOR:** Blakeslee (R)  
**TITLE:** Local Government: Housing  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Makes technical and nonsubstantive changes to a provision regarding the availability of affordable housing throughout California.

---

AB 583      **AUTHOR:** Hancock (R)  
**TITLE:** Political Reform Act: Clean Money and Fair Elections  
**PIFC Staff:** ER  
**SUMMARY:**  
Enacts the Clean Money and Fair Elections Act. Authorizes eligible candidate to obtain public funds according to specified procedures and requirements, provided that certain thresholds are attained. Imposes primary responsibility for the administration of the provisions of the bill on the Fair Political Practices Commission. Creates the Clean Money Fund.

---

AB 620      **AUTHOR:** Portantino (D)  
**TITLE:** Surplus Residential Property  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Establishes additional criteria under which the surplus property may be offered for sale to the current occupants, local governments, or nonprofit entities. Restricts the Department of Transportation in attaching terms or conditions to surplus properties on the 710 Freeway Right-of-Way and then offer the properties for sale.

AB 637      **AUTHOR:** Plescia (R)  
**TITLE:** Affordable Housing  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Relates to affordability of housing units and the use and transfer of pooled housing funds.

---

AB 645      **AUTHOR:** Feuer (D)  
**TITLE:** Traffic Violation: Adjudication  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Amends existing law which authorizes a court to order a person issued a notice to appear for a traffic violation to attend a traffic violator school licensed under certain provisions of the Vehicle Code, in lieu of adjudicating the traffic offense, and with the consent of the defendant, or after conviction of a traffic offense. Makes these provisions inapplicable to a person when the traffic offense is a hit run violation.

AB 670      **AUTHOR:** Spitzer (R)  
**TITLE:** Animals: Bites: Owner Information  
**PIFC Staff:** Everyone  
**SUMMARY:**  
Requires a person who owns or has custody or control of an animal to immediately provide identifying information to another person when the person knows, or has reason to know, the animal bit the other person.

---

AB 693      **AUTHOR:** Plescia (R)  
**TITLE:** California Emergency Service Act  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Changes the Emergency Service Act which sets forth the intent of the Legislature in enacting its provisions generally.

---

---

AB 703      **AUTHOR:** Ruskin (D)  
**TITLE:** Social Security Numbers  
**PIFC Staff:** ER  
**SUMMARY:**  
Prohibits a person or entity from using a social security number as an identifier, except as required by federal or state law. Requires that records containing social security numbers be discarded or destroyed in a specified manner. Requires the encryption or locked storage of records containing social security numbers.

---

AB 706      **AUTHOR:** Leno (D)  
**TITLE:** Fire Retardants: Toxic Effects  
**PIFC Staff:** ER  
**SUMMARY:**  
Revises and extends findings relating to fire retardants, and requires all seating, bedding, and furniture products to comply with certain requirements, including the requirement that they not contain brominated fire retardants or chlorinated fire retardants.

---

AB 731      **AUTHOR:** Solorio (D)  
**TITLE:** Health Care Coverage: Public Agencies  
**PIFC Staff:** ER  
**SUMMARY:**  
Declares the intent of the Legislature to require health care coverage providers to disclose to public agency governing boards that they contract with all fees and commissions paid to the agency's insurance broker.

---

AB 737      **AUTHOR:** Keene (R)  
**TITLE:** Small Claims Court Jurisdiction  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Extends the jurisdiction of the small claims court to include actions brought by a person, defined to include a corporation as well as a natural person, if the amount does not exceed \$7,500. Restricts a person from filing more than 2 small claims actions in which the amount demanded exceeds \$5,000 anywhere in the state in any calendar year.

AB 758      **AUTHOR:** Plescia (R)  
**TITLE:** Vehicles: Traffic Violator Schools  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Amends existing law that defines the term traffic violator school for purposes of the Vehicle Code, to mean a business that provides instruction in traffic safety. Recasts that definition to provide that the traffic violator school is licensed by the Department of Motor Vehicles and that the method of instruction may be classroom-based or by home study, including but not limited to, correspondence, handbook, video, or Internet.

AB 760

**AUTHOR:** Coto (D)

**TITLE:** Building Equity and Growth in Neighborhoods

**PIFC Staff:** MG

**SUMMARY:**

Amends existing law which establishes the Building Equity and Growth in Neighborhoods Program for the purpose of making grants to cities and counties to be used for downpayment assistance to first time home buyers. Requires the Department of Housing and Community Development to assign points to grant application that meet certain criteria. Permits the department to assign points based on the extent to which the information will be disseminated.

AB 761

**AUTHOR:** Coto (D)

**TITLE:** Farmworker Housing: Disaster Assistance

**PIFC Staff:** MP

**SUMMARY:**

Relates to the Joe Serna, Jr. Farmworker Housing Grant Program. Authorizes the department to award the specified funds for migrant farmworker housing in the form of loans for the specified purposes in counties in which a disaster has occurred, and for a period after the occurrence.

AB 773

**AUTHOR:** Blakeslee (R)

**TITLE:** Political Reform Act of 1974

**PIFC Staff:** ER

**SUMMARY:**

Relates to existing provisions of the Political Reform Act of 1974 which limit the total amount of contributions that can be made to, or accepted by, a candidate for elective state office per election.

---

AB 779

**AUTHOR:** Jones (D)

**TITLE:** Personal Information

**PIFC Staff:** ER

**SUMMARY:**

Relates to existing law which requires any person or business that conducts business in the state and that owns or licenses computerized data that includes personal information, to disclose any breach of that data.

---

AB 783

**AUTHOR:** Arambula (D)

**TITLE:** Small Community Drinking Water System Improvements

**PIFC Staff:** MP

**SUMMARY:**

Relates to bonds for the purposes of financing a safe drinking water, water quality and supply, flood control, and resource protection program. Requires the State Department of Public Health to develop a standard application form for predevelopment grant funding to finance feasibility studies and to meet eligibility requirements for a construction grant.

---

AB 792      **AUTHOR:** Garcia (R)  
**TITLE:** Affordable Housing Program  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Establishes the Environmentally Sustainable Affordable Housing Program consisting of the Construction Liability Insurance Reform Pilot Program; the Green Building, Energy Efficiency, and Building Design Program; and the Affordable Housing for Teachers Program. Requires the department to fund these programs.

---

AB 796      **AUTHOR:** Assembly Insurance Committee  
**TITLE:** Earthquake Insurance  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Amends existing law which requires an insurer who charges an additional earthquake insurance premium or deductible because a dwelling fails to meet certain criteria to not charge the same if the dwelling is brought into compliance with specified building code provisions; includes successor deductions of the building code provisions for those purposes.

---

AB 797      **AUTHOR:** Assembly Insurance Committee  
**TITLE:** Department of Insurance Curriculum Board  
**PIFC Staff:** ER  
**SUMMARY:**  
Amends existing law which requires the Insurance Commissioner to appoint a curriculum board, required to develop or recommend courses of study on various topics, and develop standards for providers and instructors of courses in connection with education requirements for insurance licenses. Provides that the board may approve standards for courses in business management practices which may consist of a percentage of the agent or broker requirements for license renewal.

AB 808      **AUTHOR:** Parra (D)  
**TITLE:** Vehicles: Licensure Application or Renewal  
**PIFC Staff:** MG  
**SUMMARY:**  
Requires as a condition of obtaining or renewing a driver's license, the applicant sign a declaration regarding driving under the influence, and potential charges that could result from killing a person as a result of driving under the influence.

---

AB 810      **AUTHOR:** Lieu (D)  
**TITLE:** School Safety Plans  
**PIFC Staff:** MP  
**SUMMARY:**  
Requires schools to make copies of their school safety plans available upon request to parents and to teachers and other members of school staff. Requires notification to parents, teachers, and other members of staff regarding revisions of such plans.

---

---

AB 822

**AUTHOR:** Levine (D)

**TITLE:** Urban Greening Projects: Permeable Surfaces

**PIFC Staff:** MP

**SUMMARY:**

Appropriates a specified amount of urban greening funds to the Resources Agency to establish a program to address the adverse impacts of urban runoff on state water quality through the strategic replacement of impermeable surfaces with permeable surfaces.

---

AB 825

**AUTHOR:** Silva (R)

**TITLE:** Persons With Developmental Disabilities

**PIFC Staff:** ER

**SUMMARY:**

Amends existing law that makes all information and records obtained in the course of providing intake assessment and services under statutes relating to services for persons with developmental disabilities confidential. Requires a regional center or state development center to disclose specified information and records to certain employees of a school district or county office of education, when disclosure is necessary.

AB 842

**AUTHOR:** Jones (D)

**TITLE:** Regional Plans: Housing and Traffic Reduction

**PIFC Staff:** MG

**SUMMARY:**

Creates eligibility standards for the funds that will be made available from the Highway Safety, Traffic Reduction, Air Quality and Port Security Bond Act of 2006 and the Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust of Fund of 2006. Requires that a project be located within a regional plan to reduce the vehicle miles traveled per household.

AB 859

**AUTHOR:** Plescia (R)

**TITLE:** Civil Procedure

**PIFC Staff:** MP

**SUMMARY:**

Requires certain documents to be filed with a levying officer under a writ of attachment or execution within 5 court days of the levy, deletes the separate requirement that an affidavit as to the manner of levy performed be filed with the levying officer. Authorizes service of process between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 p.m.

---

AB 872

**AUTHOR:** Davis (D)

**TITLE:** CEQA: Urban Infill Affordable Housing Developments

**PIFC Staff:** MG

**SUMMARY:**

Sets forth the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to exempt urban infill affordable housing developments of less than a certain number of units from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act.

---

AB 881

**AUTHOR:** Mullin (D)

**TITLE:** Vehicles: Child Passengers

**PIFC Staff:** MG

**SUMMARY:**

Requires that child who is under 8 years of age to be secured in a rear seat in an appropriate child passenger restraint system. Provides an exception from the child passenger restraint system requirement for a child who is under 8 years of age, but who is 4 feet 9 inches tall or taller and who is properly restrained by a safety belt.

AB 893

**AUTHOR:** Walters (R)

**TITLE:** Vehicles: Speeding

**PIFC Staff:** MG

**SUMMARY:**
