	<p>Amends existing law that requires the State Board of Equalization to collect a fire prevention fee to be charged on each structure on a parcel that is within a state responsibility area. Eliminates the specified civil penalty imposed for unpaid fire prevention fees.</p> <p>PIFC Position: Watch</p>
AB 1532	AUTHOR: Gatto TITLE: Vehicle Accidents STATUS: Vetoed SUMMARY:
	<p>Provides that a driver of a vehicle involved in an accident where a person is struck shall immediately stop the vehicle at the scene of the accident and provide specified information including his or her name and current residence address. Provides that a violation of these provisions would be either an infraction or a misdemeanor. Requires the immediate suspension of the driver's license of a convicted driver for a specified time period.</p> <p>PIFC Position: Watch</p>

	<p>Makes vehicular manslaughter without gross negligence committed during the course of a violation of the specified prohibitions on driving a motor vehicle while using a wireless telephone, electronic wireless communications device, or mobile service device.</p> <p>PIFC Position: Watch</p>
AB 1646	AUTHOR: Frazier TITLE: Vehicles: Electronic Wireless Communication Devices STATUS: Vetoed SUMMARY:
	<p>Requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to include questioning in each driver's license test of an applicant's knowledge and understanding of the provision of the Vehicle Code to verify the applicant has read and understands the distractions and dangers of associated with handheld cellular phone use and text messaging while operating a motor vehicle. Provides for the assessment of a point on motor vehicles records for conviction of any violation of use of a handheld phone or text messaging while driving.</p> <p>PIFC Position: Watch</p>

Increases restitution fines and prohibits the use of campaign funds to pay for the restitution fines.</p>

	<p>Extends provisions that require certain electrical, gas, water, wireless telecommunication service providers, and telephone corporations to encourage, recruit and utilize minority-, women-, disabled veteran-owned business enterprises to LGBT business enterprises. Subjects any person or corporation who falsely represents a business as an LGBT business enterprise for the purposes of the program to criminal penalties. Requires the PUC to adopt and update certification standards.</p>

Provides an expenditure limit for the above-stated purposes. Provides a definition for attorney's fees and other related costs. 	SUMMARY:	Requires with respect to the information to be included in a notification of a breach of the security of computerized data including personal information, that if the person or business was the source of the breach, appropriate identify theft prevention and mitigation services be provided for a specified time at no cost to the affected person. Prohibits the sale, advertisement for sale, or offer to sell an individual's social security number.

	CHAPTER:	526
	SUMMARY:	Amends existing law that exempts a vehicle, eligible under these provisions to use high occupancy vehicle lanes, from toll charges imposed on single-occupant vehicles in designated high-occupancy toll lanes unless prohibited by federal law. Grants a vehicle, eligible under these provisions to use HOV lanes, a toll-free or reduced-rate passage in HOT lanes.

Prohibits a licensee from advertising a vehicle's prior use or ownership history in an inaccurate manner. Authorizes the use of a rebate if the rebate meets specified requirements and is offered by a finance coany affiliated with the manufacturer or distributor, a regulated utility, or a governmental entity. Prohibits conflicting rebate advertising.

	<p>Requires, with regard to private passenger automobile insurance that provides a coverage for a specified time, residential property insurance, and policies of individual disability income insurance that are issued after a certain date, an insurer to maintain a verifiable process that allows an applicant or policyholder to designate a person to receive notice of lapse, termination, expiration, nonrenewal or cancellation of a policy. Specifies that individual does not have any rights to any benefits.</p>

Authorizes the program to require a high-occupancy vehicle to have an electronic transponder or other electronic devices for law enforcement purposes.</p>

STATUS: Pending, Senate Inactive File

SUMMARY:

Requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to assess the need for a temporary vehicle identification system that is different from the existing system. Provides requirements if a new system is in need of a change or enhancement. Requires the Department to examine the costs and benefits of employing different systems and to make recommendations as to whether the State should implement a new system.

TITLE: Timber Harvest Plans: Exemption: Flammable Materials
STATUS: Enacted
CHAPTER: 804

SUMMARY:

Amends the Z'berg-Nejedly Forest Practices Act of 1973. Authorizes the State Board of Forestry and Fire Protection to exempt from some or all of those provisions of the Act a person engaged in forest management whose activities are limited to the cutting and removal of trees on the person's property in compliance with existing law relating to defensible space. Requires the evaluation of the effects of these provisions and a report on any recommendations to the Legislature. Requires regulations.

STATUS: Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation Committee

SUMMARY:

Relates to an annual minimum franchise tax and annual tax. Reduces the minimum franchise and annual tax in the 2nd year for a new corporation, and the first taxable year for a new limited partnership, new limited liability partnership, and new limited liability company that is a small business, which is defined as a business with gross receipts of a specified amount or less.

STATUS: Enacted
CHAPTER: 728

SUMMARY:

Requires a client employer to share with a labor contractor all civil legal responsibility and liability for all workers supplied by a contractor for the payment of wages and the failure to obtain workers' compensation coverage. Prohibits an employer from shifting to a labor contractor duties under workplace safety provisions. Expects from the definition of labor contractor specified

nonprofit, labor, and motion picture payroll services organizations and 3rd parties engaged in employee leasing arrangements.

TITLE: Fire Protection Fee: State Board of Equalization

STATUS: Held in Assembly Revenue and Taxation Committee

SUMMARY:

Relates to fire protection fees. Authorizes a person to appeal any order of the department that denies all or part of a refund of fee, penalties, or interest to the State Board of Equalization.

TITLE: Global Warming Solutions Act: Community Investment

STATUS: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee

SUMMARY:

Creates the Community Investment and Innovation Program and requires moneys to be available from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund for purposes of awarding grants and other financial assistance to eligible applicants who submit plans to develop and implement integrated community-level greenhouse gas emissions reductions in their region. Requires the Strategic Growth Council to administer the program.

TITLE: Rental Vehicles: Contracts: Damage Waivers

STATUS: Enacted

CHAPTER: 417

SUMMARY:

Relates to rental vehicle contracts and damage waivers. Removes the manufacturer's suggested retail price as a criteria for the rate of a damage waiver sold by a rental coany. Increases the maximum rate of the damage waiver only for rental vehicles designated as an economy or coact car. Increases the maximum rate of the damage waiver per rental day for rental vehicles in the specified body size categories of vehicles that are within a specified model year. Provides a rate for older models.

STATUS: Enacted

CHAPTER: 896

SUMMARY:

Regulates pet insurance policies. Specifies disclosures an insurer of pet insurance is required to make to consumers. Requires an insurer of pet insurance to disclose, whether the policy excludes coverage because of a preexisting condition, a hereditary disorder or a congenital anomaly or disorder. Requires a free look cancellation period. Authorizes hearings to determine if an insurer is in violation of the provisions governing pet insurance and to assess a civil penalty.

	CHAPTER:	419
	SUMMARY:	Relates to residential earthquake insurance. Revises the disclosure language an insurer is required to use in offering coverage. Makes the contents of that language dependent upon whether the insurer is a member of the Earthquake Authority or not. Requires insureds to be provided with specified disclosures concerning coverage of losses, liability limitations and premiums. Requires insurers to provide insureds with CEA marketing documents. Increases the cap on the Authority's operating expenses.

	STATUS:	Pending, Assembly Insurance Committee
	SUMMARY:	Amends the Charter-Party Carriers' Act. Includes within the definition of charter-party carrier of passengers a person that uses an online-enabled application to connect with drivers. Makes changes concerning procurement and continuation of adequate assurances of protection against liability. Requires the Public Utilities Commission to develop a standard disclosure agreement with specified insurance disclosures that is included in a written agreement between drivers and charter-party carriers of passengers.

	STATUS:	Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee
	SUMMARY:	Amends existing law that requires a county to establish a one-time amnesty program for fines and bail due on or before a specified date, for certain infraction or misdemeanor violations of the Vehicle Code and Penal Code. Revises these provisions to authorize a court or county on or after and before specified dates, and upon an agreement of both the court and the county, to implement similar amnesty programs for fines and bail due on or before a specified date. Requires the programs according to guidelines.

	CHAPTER:	528
	SUMMARY:	Requires the San Diego Association of Governments and the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority to establish, with the consent of the State Department of Transportation, appropriate performance measures, such as speed or travel times, for the purpose of ensuring optimal use of the HOT lanes by high-occupancy vehicles without adversely affecting other traffic on the state

highway system. Provides vehicles using these lanes may be required to have an electronic devices. Requires improvements.

SUMMARY:

Amends the Z'Berg-Nejedly Forest Practice Act of 1973 that prohibits a person from conducting timber operations unless a timber harvesting plan prepared by a registered professional forester has been submitted to, and is approved by, the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection. Requires the notice of extension to be provided to the Department not sooner than or later than a specified number of day prior to the expiration of the plan.

SUMMARY:

Revises and recasts provisions to require each admitted insurer with annual premiums equal or in excess to a specified amount for any reporting year to provide information on all of its community development investments, community development infrastructure investments, and green investments in the State. Revises the information the Insurance Commissioner and the Department of Insurance are required to provide on the Department's Internet Web site and extends the Web site's publication date.

SUMMARY:

Amends existing law that provides for the Forest Fire Prevention Pilot Project Exemption. Expands that exemption to include activities within the Counties of Del Norte, Humboldt, Mendocino, or Sonoma.

SUMMARY:

Requires a State agency that uses an Internet Web site to obtain information by means of an electronic form and shares the information with another agency, to include a specified disclosure notice clearly displayed. Requires the disclosure to acknowledge the information is being collected and may be shared. Prohibits the entity using an electronic form to utilize or share any information provided on the form until the person entering the information into the form specifically acts to submit the form.

	STATUS:	Held in Senate Appropriations Committee
	SUMMARY:	Requires a person who is required to be registered under the federal act who submits an application for an original or renewal of a driver's license to be deemed to have consented to registration with the federal Selective Service System. Requires specified notices on an application for an original or renewal of a driver's license and requires the department to forward the necessary personal information required for registration to the federal Selective Service System in an electronic format.

	SUMMARY:	Amends existing law that requires vehicle registration fees to be paid quarterly to the Controller and requires the moneys allocated to a county to be expended exclusively to fund programs that enhance the capacity of local police and prosecutors to deter, investigate, and prosecute vehicle theft crimes and for counties with a specified population the moneys may be expended for violation of driving under the influence. Provides these provisions apply to a county with a revised population count.

	SUMMARY:	Provides a private patrol operator or applicant for licensure, as a condition precedent to licensure or continued licensure, to file or have on file an insurance policy providing minimum limits of insurance for any one loss due to bodily injury, including death, or property damage, or both. Exempts a duly appointed police officer working security, who is authorized to carry a firearm, from firearm requalification. Provides procedures for firearm assignment. Suspends a license for not maintaining insurance.

Increases that market value.

Requires a examination period and return policy be affixed to disability insurance policy or life insurance policy and certificate offered for sale to individuals of a minimum age, and their requirements apply to individual and group disability and group life insurance policies and certificates. Provides the standards for such policy. Authorizes the return of the policy by mail or other delivery method. Requires prorated refunds. Relates to annuity disclosures. Relates to surrender charge requirements.

Authorizes the Commissioner, after providing notice and an opportunity for a hearing, to suspend or rescind the certificate if a complaint cannot be resolved in a timely manner.

Increases the number of days within which the commissioner is required to publish adopted report and any comments submitted by the insurer.

	SUMMARY:	Enacts the Wage Theft Recovery Act. Authorizes specified employees to request the Labor Commission record a wage lien upon real and personal property of an employer, or a property owner, for unpaid wages, other compensation owed the employee, and certain penalties, interest, and costs. Prescribes requirements relating to the recording and enforcement of the wage lien. Authorizes a procedure to release the lien by the employer, if the employer makes specified contentions. Requires a related report.
