Senate Appropriations Committee Hearing, August 4, 2014 PIFC Position: Support

The Personal Insurance Federation of California, representing seven of the nation's largest insurance companies (State Farm, Farmers, Liberty Mutual Insurance, Progressive, Allstate, Mercury and Nationwide) who collectively write a majority of the personal line auto and home insurance in California, supports AB 2735 Earthquake Insurance by the Assembly Committee on Insurance.

AB 2735 would provide a simple clarification that if a consumer has purchased the California Earthquake Authority's (CEA) Choice Product, they would not also receive an additional, confusing and erroneous offer stating they do not have earthquake insurance. The intent of creating the Choice Product was to give consumers additional options and without this necessary technical fix, consumers are at risk of confusion.

This language reflects the work of the CEA and the insurance industry and would ensure consumers receive consistent communication about their earthquake insurance options in California.
