PIFC Position: Support

The Personal Insurance Federation of California, representing six of the nation's largest insurance companies (State Farm, Farmers, Liberty Mutual Insurance, Progressive, Allstate and Mercury) who collectively write a majority of the personal line auto and home insurance in California, **supports AB 313: Vehicles: Electronic Wireless Communications Devices by Assemblymember Jim Frazier.**

AB 313 would amend California law to prohibit drivers from utilizing voice-activated electronic devices to send, receive, or listen to text-based communications while behind the wheel.

PIFC and its member companies have a long history of supporting legislation that serves to prevent injuries and enhance public safety. Text messaging while driving, even when the driver is using a hands-free device, is a distraction and is dangerous. With voice-activated text messaging growing in popularity among drivers, now is the time to prohibit this practice.

AB 313 is a common sense measure that will help minimize driver distraction and will ensure safer driving conditions for everyone.
