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Assembly Bills

AB 1

Title: Water Quality: Integrated Plan: Salinas Valley

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee

Summary: Appropriates funds for use by the Greater Monterey County Regional Water Management Group, referred to as the management group, to develop the integrated plan to address the drinking water and wastewater needs of disadvantaged communities in the Salinas Valley whose waters have been affected by waste discharges.

Title: Reserve Peace Officers: Emergency Rescue Personnel

Status: Chaptered No. 120

Sections Affected: An act to amend Section 230.4 of the Labor Code, relating to employees.

Summary: Requires specified employers to permit an employee who performs emergency duty as a volunteer firefighter, reserve peace officer, or as emergency rescue personnel to take a leave of absence for the purpose of engaging in fire, law enforcement, or emergency rescue training.

Title: Vehicles: Enhanced Driver's License

Status: Assembly Transportation Committee

Summary: Authorizes the Department of Motor Vehicles to enter into a memorandum of understanding with a federal agency for the purpose of facilitating travel within the western hemisphere pursuant to the federal Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative through the issuance of an enhanced driver's license, instruction permit, provisional license, or identification card. Prohibits the acquisition of such license or permit as a condition of employment.

Title: Internet Voting Pilot Program

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee

Summary: Establishes an Internet Voting Pilot Program under which a county may offer Internet voting as an additional method of voting in a local election held within the county, provided specified conditions apply. Requires the Secretary of State to certify such system before it may be used by a county. Provides that if a county conducts such program, it would be required to evaluate the program and the county's experience with the voting system and to report thereon. Requires a test of the program.

AB 22**Author:** Blumenfield**Title:** Sidewalk: Repairs**Status:** Assembly Local Government Committee**Summary:** Prohibits a city, county, or city and county that has an ordinance in operation that requires it to repair or reconstruct streets, sidewalks, or driveways that have been damaged as a result of tree growth from repealing the ordinance without the concurrence of the local electorate by majority vote.**PIFC Position:** Watch**AB 23****Author:** Donnelly**Title:** State Responsibility Areas: Fire Prevention Fees**Status:** Assembly Appropriations Committee**Summary:** Repeals existing law that requires the State Board of Forestry and Fire Protection to adopt emergency regulations to establish a fire prevention fee.**PIFC Position:** Watch**AB 25****Author:** Campos**Title:** Employment: Social Media**Status:** Senate**Summary:** Applies existing law that prohibits a private employer from requiring or requesting an employee or applicant for employment to disclose a username or password for the purpose of accessing personal social media, to access personal social media in the presence of the employer, or to divulge any personal social media to public employers. Provides that these provisions apply to public employers generally, including charter cities and counties.**PIFC Position:** Watch**AB 32****Author:** Perez J**Title:** Insurance Taxes: Income Taxes: Credits**Status:** Chaptered No. 608**Sections Affected:** An act to amend Sections 12209, 17053.57, and 23657 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.**Summary:** Amends the Personal Income Tax and the Corporation Tax laws that provide a credit for a qualified investment made to a community development financial institution. Provides required application information. Relates to limitation on the aggregate amount of qualified investments. Requires that the annual aggregate amount of qualified investments be reserved for investment amounts of less than or equal to a specified amount. Requires a report on the effects of the credits allowed. Authorizes regulations.**PIFC Position:** Support**AB 43****Author:** Bocanegra**Title:** Income Taxes: Credits: Adoption Costs

Status: Assembly Revenue and Taxation Committee

Summary: Amends the Personal Income Tax Law that authorizes a credit for a percentage of specified adoption costs, not to exceed a specified amount per minor child. Increases the maximum amount of that credit.

Title: Political Reform Act of 1974

Status: Senate Elections and Constitutional Amendments Committee

Summary: Amends the Political Reform Act of 1974. Defines the terms candidate and committee. Increases the monetary threshold of contributions or independent expenditures that qualify a person or combination of persons as a committee. Requires the Fair Political Practices Commission to adopt regulations establishing reporting thresholds for disclosure of contributions and expenditures for a committee formed primarily to support or oppose a statewide ballot measure and to adjust those thresholds.

Title: Emergency Telephone System: Abuse

Status: Senate Inactive File

Summary: Makes any person who calls the 911 telephone system to dispatch a police, sheriff, fire department, or emergency medical service personnel response to a residence or place of business where there is no emergency, with the intent to annoy or harass another person, and any or all of such entities are dispatched as a result of the call, is guilty of a misdemeanor. Provides criminal penalties if any great bodily injuries are incurred in the response. Relates to liability for all reasonable related costs.

Title: Driver's Licenses: Eligibility: Required Documentation

Status: Chaptered No. 524

Sections Affected: An act to amend, repeal, and add Sections 1653.5, 12800, 12801, and 12801.5 of, and to add Sections 12801.9, 12801.10, and 12801.11 to, the Vehicle Code, relating to driver's licenses.

Summary: Requires the issuance of an original driver's license to a person who is unable to submit satisfactory proof that the applicant's presence in the United States is authorized under federal law if he or she meets all other qualifications for licensure and provides proof of his or her identity and State residency. Requires a report concerning instances where such licenses are used to discriminate against an individual. Makes any related discrimination a violation. Relates to action regarding a person's status.

Title: Fifth-Wheel Travel Trailers

Status: Chaptered No. 548

Sections Affected: An act to add Section 35400.6 to the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.

Summary: Exempts from the prohibition of vehicles of a specified length, a 5th-wheel travel trailer that does not exceed a specified length for a specified vehicle combination. Requires the manufacturer of such vehicle that meets the exemption to include in the delivery documents specified length information necessary to register the trailer. Permits a dealer to reject acceptance of the trailer if the documentation is not provided.

Title: Property Insurance: Seismic Safety Account

Status: Chaptered No. 27

Sections Affected: An act to add Section 12975.9 to the Insurance Code, relating to property insurance, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

Summary: Creates the Seismic Safety Account. Imposes an assessment on each person who owns real property, commercial or residential, that is covered by a property insurance policy. Requires the insurance to collect the assessment from the policyholder or the policyholder may remit the assessment on the insurer's behalf to the Department of Insurance. Makes the insurer responsible for any amount not remitted to the department. Authorizes the department to charge a late fee.

Title: State Responsibility Areas: Fire Prevention Fees

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee

Summary: Repeals existing law that requires the State Board of forestry and Fire protection to adopt emergency regulations to establish a fire prevention fee to be charged on each habitable structure on a parcel that is within a state responsibility area. Requires that the fire prevention fee be adjusted annually using prescribed methods.

Title: Fire Safety: Fire Retardants: Building Insulation

Status: Chaptered No. 579

Sections Affected: An act to add Section 13108.1 to the Health and Safety Code, relating to fire safety.

Summary: Requires the State Fire Marshal to review the flammability standards for building insulation materials, including the flammability standards for some insulation materials can only be met with the addition of chemical flame retardants. Requires the Marshal to propose for consideration by the State Building Codes Commission updated insulation flammability standards that accomplish certain things, including overall building fire safety.

AB 167**Author:** Hagman**Title:** Unfair Competition: Private Enforcement Actions**Status:** Assembly Judiciary Committee**Summary:** Amends existing law that defines unfair competition to include an unlawful, unfair, or fraudulent business act or practice, unfair, deceptive, untrue, or misleading advertising, and any false representations to the public. Defines the injury in fact required for a private person to bring suit under these provisions as damages suffered by each individual plaintiff or member of a class.**PIFC Position:** Watch**AB 184****Author:** Gatto**Title:** Statutes of Limitations**Status:** Signed by the Governor**Sections Affected:** An act to amend Section 803 of the Penal Code, relating to statute of limitations.**Summary:** Provides that if a person flees the scene of an accident that has caused death or permanent, serious injury, charges may be brought within a specified time period after the completion of the offense or after the person is identified as a suspect in the commission of the offense, whichever is later, but in no case later than a specified time period after the commission of the offense.**PIFC Position:** Watch**AB 211****Author:** Wilk**Title:** Unfair Competition: Enforcement**Status:** Assembly**Summary:** States the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation that would protect businesses from frivolous lawsuits.**PIFC Position:** Watch**AB 212****Author:** Lowenthal B**Title:** Unclaimed Property**Status:** Chaptered No. 362**Sections Affected:** An act to amend Sections 1513.5 and 1530 of the Code of Civil Procedure, relating to unclaimed property.**Summary:** Amends the Unclaimed Property Law. Requires a person holding escheated property to include in his or her report to the Controller the name and last known address of the apparent owner of any escheated property, except travelers checks and money orders, with a specified value or greater. Allows the holder to report information regarding escheated items worth less than a specified value in certain cases. Authorizes a banking or financial institution to impose a service charge for notice in certain cases.**PIFC Position:** Watch

AB 218**Author:** Dickinson**Title:** Employment Applications: Criminal History**Status:** Chaptered No. 699**Sections Affected:** An act to add Section 432.9 to the Labor Code, relating to employment.**Summary:** Prohibits a state or local agency from asking an applicant for employment to disclose information regarding a criminal conviction until the agency has determined the applicant meets the minimum employment qualifications for the position. Includes specified findings and declarations of the Legislature in support of this policy.**PIFC Position:** Watch

AB 223**Author:** Olsen**Title:** Civil Actions: Disabled Access**Status:** Assembly Judiciary Committee**Summary:** Permits a local government to file a request for a court stay and early evaluation conference pursuant to provisions related to construction-related accessibility claims.**PIFC Position:** Watch

AB 229**Author:** Perez J**Title:** Infrastructure and Revitalization Financing Districts**Status:** Assembly Inactive File**Summary:** Authorizes the creation by a city, county, city and county, and joint powers authority, of an infrastructure and revitalization financing district and the issuance of debt with voter approval. Authorizes the creation of a district and the issuance of debt. Authorizes a district to finance projects in redevelopment project areas and former redevelopment project areas and former military bases.**PIFC Position:** Watch

AB 231**Author:** Ting**Title:** Firearms: Criminal Storage**Status:** Chaptered No. 730**Sections Affected:** An act to amend Sections 25100, 25110, and 26835 of the Penal Code, relating to firearms.**Summary:** Establishes a misdemeanor offense of criminal storage of a firearm in the 3rd degree when a person keeps a loaded firearm within any premises under his or her custody or control and negligently stores or leaves that firearm in a location where the person knows, or reasonable should know, that a child is likely to gain access to the firearm, without permission, unless reasonable action is taken by the person to secure the firearm against access by the child. Requires dealer-posted warnings.**PIFC Position:** Watch

Title: Privacy: Internet

Status: Assembly Judiciary Committee

Summary: Requires the privacy policy of a commercial Web site or online service that collects personally identifiable information through the Internet to be written in clear and concise language, and to include a statement indicating whether the personally identifiable information may be sold or shared with others, and how and with whom it may be shared.

Title: Commercial Web Sites and Online Services

Status: Assembly Judiciary Committee

Summary: Requires the privacy policy of a commercial web site or online service provider that collects personally identifiable information to require that policy to identify the uses and retention period for each category of such information and to describe the process the operator maintains allowing an individual consumer to review and request information changes. Requires the operator to use reasonable security safeguards to protect such information from unauthorized access, use, disclosure or modification.

Title: Vehicles: High-Occupancy Vehicle Lanes

Status: Chaptered No. 405

Sections Affected: An act to amend Section 21655.9 of, and to amend and repeal Section 5205.5 of, the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.

Summary: Extends the operation of existing law that authorizes the Department of Transportation to designate certain lanes for the exclusive use of high-occupancy vehicles to include certain low-emission vehicles. Authorizes until a specified date or a specified condition, the Department to issue a valid identifier to a vehicle that meets the state's transitional zero-emission vehicle standard. Deletes obsolete provisions relating to hybrid vehicles.

Title: Vehicle Registration: Late Penalties: Waiver

Status: Assembly Transportation Committee

Summary: Requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to waive delinquent registration fees and penalties when a transferee or purchaser of a vehicle applies for a transfer of registration if the department determines that the fees became due or the penalties accrued prior to the purchase of the vehicle.

Title: Income Taxes: Hiring Credits: Investment Credits

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee

Summary: Amends the Personal Income Tax and the Corporation Tax laws that provides a credit for each full-time employee hired by a qualified employer. Calculates the cut-off date for the hiring credit. Allows a credit, in modified conformity with a federal New Market Tax Credit, in a specified amount for investments in low-income communities. Limits the total amount for investments in low-income communities and limits that cumulative total amount of the credit. Requires application fees to defray tax credit costs.

Title: Vehicles: Motor Carrier

Status: Chaptered No. 96

Sections Affected: An act to amend Section 34620 of the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.

Summary: Prohibits the retrieval of a vehicle by, or the release of a vehicle to, a motor carrier of property using a tow truck until the carrier provides a copy of its permit to the releasing carrier. Requires the carrier releasing the vehicle to maintain a copy of the permit for a specified time period. Exempts a person licensed under the Collateral Recovery Act.

Title: Vehicles: Electronic Wireless Communications Devices

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee

Summary: Deletes an exception to the prohibition for the use, while driving, of an electronic wireless communications device that is specifically designed and configured to allow voice-operated and hands-free operation to dictate, send, or listen to a text-based communication. Relates to distracted driving.

Title: Timber Harvesting Plans: Exempt Activities

Status: Assembly Natural Resources Committee

Summary: Amends the Z'berg-Nejedly Forest Practice Act of 1973. Exempts the removal of trees less than 28 inches in stump diameter, measured at 8 inches above ground level. Permits the removal of trees less than 28 inches in stump diameter to achieve the goal of fuel reduction if the removal of any such tree is within 500 feet of a legally permitted structure in an area prioritized as a shaded fuel break in a community wildfire protection plan approved by a public fire agency.

Title: Workers' Compensation: Independent Contractors

Status: Assembly

Summary: Makes technical, nonsubstantive changes to existing law which defines an independent contractor for purposes of workers' compensation law.

Title: Women, Minority, Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee

Summary: Amends existing law that directs the Public Utilities commission to require every electrical, gas, water, wireless telecommunications service provider, and telephone corporation with annual gross revenues of a specified amount and their regulated subsidiaries and affiliates, to implement a program developed by the commission to encourage, recruit, and utilize defined minority-, women- and disabled veteran-owned business enterprises. Revises the definition of minority business enterprise.

Title: Limited Liability Companies: Filings

Status: Assembly Banking and Finance Committee

Summary: Requires a limited liability company to annually file a specified informational form. Revises the applicable filing period for limited liability companies.

Title: Consumers: Internet Privacy

Status: Chaptered No. 390

Sections Affected: An act to amend Section 22575 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to consumers.

Summary: Requires the operator of a commercial Web site to disclose how it responds to do not track signals or other mechanisms that provide consumers a choice regarding the collection of personally identifiable information about an individual consumer's online activities over time and across different Web sites or online services. Requires the operator to disclose whether other parties may collect personally identifiable information when a consumer uses the operator's Web site or service.

Title: Regulations: Notice

Status: Assembly Accountability and Administrative Review Committee

Summary: Requires a state agency enforcing a regulation promulgated on or after a specified date to notify a business that is required to comply with that regulation of the existence of the regulation 30 days before its effective date, and to cooperate with the Secretary of State to

access business records to obtain the business contact information necessary to provide that notice.

Title: Vehicles: Emergency Contact Locator Database

Status: Assembly Transportation Committee

Summary: Enacts the State Motor Vehicle Emergency Contact Locator Act of 2013. Requires a motor vehicle manufacturer of a new motor vehicle sold or leased in this state on or after a specified date, with a 2014 model year or later to provide a means by which a purchaser or lessee of a new motor vehicle can voluntarily designate at the original retail point of sale an emergency contact to be stored in a specified database. Provides that information shall be available only to law enforcement.

Title: Pedestrians: Highway Workers

Status: Assembly Transportation Committee

Summary: Exempts a highway worker from provisions of existing law requiring that a pedestrian upon a roadway yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the roadway so near as to constitute an immediate hazard, unless the pedestrian is within a crosswalk, pedestrian tunnel, or overhead crossing, and prohibits a pedestrian from crossing the roadway at any place except in a crosswalk.

Title: Fire Protection: Residential Care Facilities

Status: Assembly Governmental Organization Committee

Summary: Requires a residential care facility for the elderly or adult residential facility that has a valid license as of a specified date, to have installed and maintained an operable automatic fire sprinkler system approved by the State Fire Marshal. Requires a facility which is licensed after a specified date to have such system installed. Requires the facility owner to pay all related costs.

Title: Insurance: Disaster Management: Preparedness Surcharge

Status: Assembly Natural Resources Committee

Summary: Creates the Disaster Management, Preparedness, and Assistance Fund. Requires the payment of a special purpose surcharge on each commercial and residential fire and multiperil insurance policy entitled the Disaster Management, Preparedness, and Assistance Surcharge. Provides the moneys from the surcharge would be deposited in the fund and

appropriated for funding emergency activities as well as local government disaster planning and response. Requires related duties for such insurers admitted in the state.

Title: Local Government: Taxes, Fees, Assessments, and Charges

Status: Chaptered No. 552

Sections Affected: An act to add Section 53758 to the Government Code, relating to local government, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

Summary: Amends existing law, which provided a Constitutional amendment that prescribes specific procedures and parameters for local jurisdiction when complying with specified articles thereof regarding the requirement for voter approval of any imposition, extension, or increase of any special tax, and permits the use of the initiative to affect local taxes, assessments, fees, and charges. Defines the terms specific benefit and specific government purpose for purposes of the State Constitution.

Title: Vehicles: Confidential Home Address

Status: Assembly Transportation Committee

Summary: Requires a person who requests the confidentiality of his or her home address to provide the Department of Motor Vehicles with a current employment address for purposes of processing service and collection of a traffic, parking, or toll road violation. Requires the applicable statutory time period for processing the service and collection of such violations be tolled until the department provides specified agencies with the person's current employment address. Requires to work related confidentiality.

Title: Community Investment

Status: Assembly Banking and Finance Committee

Summary: Establishes the Community Investment Initiative. Requires the Initiative to create a database of low-income neighborhoods, compile and maintain an inventory of State public sector funding resources and financing mechanisms, coordinate public sector financial investment and public programs to assist low-income communities to become business, development, and investment ready, develop criteria for equity funds, local governments wanting to partner with equity funds to invest in such neighborhoods.

Title: Vehicles

Status: Chaptered No. 392

Sections Affected: An act to amend Section 25250.51 of the Health and Safety Code, to amend Section 42950 of the Public Resources Code, and to amend Sections 12200, 12204, and 34601 of the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.

Summary: Permits motor vehicle dealers to continue to sell or offer for sale brake friction material not certified as compliant, under a specified condition. Updates the definition of a tire brokers. Relates to the definition of an eligible claim through the Recovery Corporation against a dealer or lessor-retailer for failure to provide a clean title or to pay a payment for insurance, a service contract, or services purchased through the dealer or lessor-retailer. Relates to the commercial motor vehicle definition.

Title: Office of Small and Disabled Veteran Business

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee

Summary: Requires the head of a state agency to ensure a state contracting program is administered in a manner that promotes small business participation. Requires the head of the agency to annually review small business participation levels and to develop a plan for increasing small business participation levels when levels are low. Requires the Department of General Services and the Office of the Small Business Advocate to serve as a resource to assist the heads of agencies identify contracting best practices.

Title: Insurance: Risk and Solvency Assessment

Status: Chaptered No. 238

Sections Affected: An act to add Article 10.6 (commencing with Section 935.1) to Chapter 1 of Part 2 of Division 1 of the Insurance Code, relating to insurance.

Summary: Requires an insurer to maintain a risk management framework, to conduct a less than annually an Own Risk and Solvency Assessment and to submit a related report to the Insurance Commissioner. Exempts certain insurers. Provides that documents, materials, and other information presented to the Commissioner is confidential. Provides insurers that fail, without just cause, to timely file the required report, would be subject to specified late filing fees.

Status: Assembly Housing and Community Development Committee

Summary: Extends the date by which smoke detectors need to have certain features to be approved and listed. Authorizes the State fire Marshal to suspend enforcement of these requirements if certain conditions exist.

AB 658**Author:** Calderon I**Title:** Personal Information: Disclosure**Status:** Chaptered No. 296**Sections Affected:** An act to amend Section 56.06 of the Civil Code, relating to personal information.**Summary:** Applies the prohibitions of the Confidentiality of Medical Information Act to any business that offers software or hardware, to consumers including a mobile application or other related device that is designed to maintain medical information to allow an individual to manage his or her information, or for the diagnosis, treatment, or management of a medical condition of the individual.**PIFC Position:** Watch**AB 674****Author:** Quirk-Silva**Title:** Microenterprise**Status:** Assembly Jobs, Economic Development, and The Economy Committee**Summary:** Amends existing law that defines microenterprise and encourages specified local agencies to access, include, and promote local partnerships that invest in microenterprise development. Expands the definition of microenterprise to include those entities that have fewer than 10 employees, including the owner.**PIFC Position:** Watch**AB 724****Author:** Cooley**Title:** Vehicles: Driver's Licenses**Status:** Assembly Appropriations Committee**Summary:** Expands the scope of the provisional driver's licensing program by extending the applicable age range. Permits a provisions licensee to keep in his or her possession a copy of his or her class schedule to satisfy an exception for schooling or school-authorized activities and a copy of his or her work schedule as an exception for employment necessity.
