PIFC Position: Support

The Personal Insurance Federation of California, representing insurers who write over 50 percent of the auto insurance sold in the state, including State Farm, Farmers, Safeco, aigdirect.com, Progressive and NAMIC, **is in support of SB 28 authored by Senator Simitian**.

SB 28 would 1) prohibit all drivers from using an electronic wireless communications device to write, send or read a text-based communication, 2) define "write, send or read a text-based communication" and, 3) make driving while texting punishable by a \$20 fine for the first offense and a \$50 fine for each subsequent offense.

PIFC and its member companies have a long history of supporting legislation that serves to prevent injuries and enhance public safety. Text messaging while driving is a distraction and is dangerous. With text messaging growing in popularity among drivers, other states have passed laws to prohibit this practice. California should follow Connecticut, Minnesota, New Jersey and Washington and ban driving while texting.

SB 28 is a common sense measure that will help minimize driver distraction and will ensure safer driving conditions for everyone.
